FALL LEAF & LIMB RECYCLING SCHEDULE

Leaves must be raked to the curb in a windrow no further than 6 feet from the road's edge.

NO BAGGED LEAVES! NO GRASS!

DO NOT place any trash, branches, stones, dirt or debris in the windrow. Limbs must be placed 6 feet away from the leaves. Also remember that leaf and limb piles must be 10 feet away from all storm drains as stated in Borough Ordinance 2006-15 Chapter 145 Article VI.

All residents should have their leaves and limbs out for removal during the two scheduled pick-up periods.

FIRST PERIOD: SAT, OCTOBER 21 – SUN, NOVEMBER 5 SECOND PERIOD: SAT, NOVEMBER 18-SUN, DECEMBER 3

There should be nothing placed in the streets from December 4th until Spring of 2024. Also, there should nob be any leaves, grass or limbs in the trash or recycling carts. Leaves and limbs can be taken to the public works building during normal working hours with an appointment. Call 856-697-4332 for an appointment.
