Look for these events and more at **Your** Library. We have free Wi-Fi, newspapers, magazines, digital resources, dvd's, music, copier and notary services, and so much more!

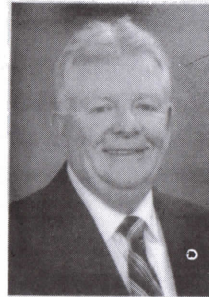
